Welcome to the re-opening of Stageworks!

It feels so good to be back and with such a heartwarming, fun holiday surprise for you and your family. We're so excited to see people back in our seats.

When we went dark in March, we thought at most we would be closed for four weeks. The joke was on us, right? Because we were unable to operate, our Board spent the last eight months reworking our financial plan to keep our theatre alive. We've made some really tough choices to reduce expenses, including relinquishing the leases on 50% of our space. We also secured a long-term SBA emergency loan to pay ongoing expenses and reinvest into a new sterilization ventilation system to prevent the spread of COVID-19. This has been a test of patience and perseverance and, though we are not out of the woods, we just love making great theatre!

Theatre teaches and reminds us of many things. It soothes life's aches and pains, cures the blues, enables the possibilities, and reinvents our passion and authenticity. But what this pandemic has taught us more than anything is to not forget how we touch people and, in return, how they touch us! I want to personally thank the Board, our artists, and our volunteers for getting us to this point. I also want to thank the many who have tossed into the hat to keep this going. We are so blessed! One group specifically not only contributed financially to our cause and literally saved us from the brink in the first few dark months of this catastrophe, but also rallied our organization to keep going. The Shining Stars Guild is a brilliant collection of beautiful, distinguished people who inspire us to keep going. And, Larry and Diane Lipton have been mentors and cheerleaders for our rise back to the stage again. Both The Shining Stars and Larry and Diane deserve so much love for their support, energy, and passion for arts in the community. Their contributions deserve a round of applause!

The curtain rising again has been twisting and turning, and it is sure to be interesting in the future. But, for today, we get to forget about everything, and once again spill our passion onto the stage and bring joy to our fans. For that, we are truly thankful this holiday season and so excited for you to be back.

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ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Tom Dudzick had his first play, *Greetings!* produced off-Broadway at the John Houseman Theatre, starring Darren McGavin; it is now a holiday favorite all across the country. Mr. Dudzick went on to write a comedic semi-autobiographical series of plays about growing up Catholic in Buffalo called the Over the Tavern Trilogy, which has been one of the biggest grassroots successes in American regional theatre. Mr. Dudzick's home theatre, Buffalo's Studio Arena, then commissioned his idea about a parochial school novice who takes religion into her own hands, entitled Hail Mary! Next up for Studio Arena was Don't Talk to the Actors, a hilarious semi-autobiographical backstage comedy, which boasted a star-studded cast including Denny Dillon, Richard Kline, and Lewis J. Stadlen. Mr. Dudzick's newest work, Miracle on South Division Street is based on a local Buffalo legend wherein the Blessed Virgin Mary materialized in a barbershop in the author's old neighborhood. The comedy was produced off-Broadway, where it was praised by audiences and The New York Times. Mr. Dudzick lives in Nyack, New York with his wife and two children.

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
